

Institutional Profile

The University of Guam is an open-admissions, U.S. land-grant public comprehensive university offering on a semester basis 16 master's degree programs, 25 bachelor's degree programs, and several certificate programs in both onsite and online course offerings. These programs are administered by the College of Liberal Arts and Social Sciences ("CLASS"), the College of Natural and Applied Sciences ("CNAS"), the School of Business and Public Administration ("SBPA"), the School of Engineering ("SENG"), the School of Education ("SOE"), and the School of Health ("SOH"). In addition, continuing education unit (CEU) classes, professional development training, and English language training are offered through the Global Learning and Engagement (GLE) Office. The Enrollment Management & Student Success ("EMSS") Division supports student success and student life with services from Admissions & Records, Financial Aid Office, Residence Hall, Student Counseling, Student Health, Student Life Office, and TRiO Programs. Fanuchånan (Fall) 2022 student enrollment was 2,962. The University of Guam has conferred over 20,000 degrees over the past 70 years.

Research is an integral part of our mission, as UOG is a land-grant university. UOG's researchers from the various research units, including the Marine Lab, the Water & Environmental Research Institute, the Western Pacific Tropical Research Center, the Center for Excellence in Developmental Disabilities Education, Research & Service, and the Micronesian Area Research Center, continue to support UOG's Para Hulo' strategic initiative of "being recognized as a RESEARCH UNIVERSITY centered in island wisdom." Through our diverse research portfolio — whether we are studying Karst geology, Guam's aquifer, childhood obesity, factors contributing to cancer health disparities, coral reef health, developmental disabilities, endangered plants, or invasive species — we are contributing to the knowledge and wisdom of our island residents.

Our University holds an impressive national standing for an institution of our size. In the latest data released from the National Center for Science and Engineering Statistics, UOG ranks in the top 43% of institutions for total grant-funded research and development expenditures. We are pleased to report that continued progress has been made in our research efforts, and this has been another great year for research and scholarly achievements here at the University of Guam. In FY2022, UOG continued its ongoing grants, including the National Science Foundation—funded EPSCoR-GECCO grant, the National Cancer Institute—funded Pacific Island Partnership for Cancer Health Equity (U54-PIPCHE) grant, the National Oceanic & Atmospheric Administration—funded Sea Grant, and CEDDERS funding. We also received new cycles of NASA EPSCoR Research Infrastructure Development funding and funding for the Pacific Islands Climate Adaptation Science Center. In FY2022, we continued to collaborate with multiple off-island scientists and institutions, provided employment to the local community, and offered students the opportunity to gain valuable research experience. (ORSP)








Financial Aid Awards (AY2022-2023)

The total amount of financial aid awarded to students for AY2022-2023 was \$17,579,299. 34% came from federal scholarships and grants, 24% from federal loans, 12% from Government of Guam programs, 9% from regional awards, 7% from institutional awards, 5% from VA/GI Bill, and 3% from private scholarships.



FY 2022 Financial Trends

The University's overall financial position remains stable. Application of accounting standards pertaining to pensions (GASB 67,68,73) and post-employment benefits other than pension (GASB 75) continues to have a significant impact on the University's financial statements. In FY22, the University implemented GASB 87, which changed the reporting of leases in the University's financial statements. Despite the continued decline in enrollment and the reduction of appropriation from the Government of Guam, the University's net position continues to improve in the last two fiscal years. Factors contributing to the change are as follows:


- Recovery of expenses related to disruption of campus operations due to COVID-19 through HEERF continued throughout FY22. The University is at the tail end of its pandemic relief grants in FY23.
- The University has been achieving the goals set forth in its \$20 million grant from the National Science Foundation FPSCOR
- The University was awarded \$3.4 million to manage and operate the Guam Cultural Repository.

COMPARATIVE REVENUES (IN \$1,000)

In FY2022, university-generated revenues amounted to \$82.8 million, or 70% of the University's total revenue of \$117.9 million, with a Government of Guam allotment of \$35.1 million, or 30%. The University continues to experience an increase in federal grant activity, mainly pertaining to the National Science

Foundation's Experimental Program to Stimulate Competitive Research (EPSCoR), National Cancer Institute-funded Pacific Island Partnership for Cancer Health Equity (U54-PIPCHE), and the remaining Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (HEERF).




COMPARATIVE EXPENSES (IN \$1,000)

Of the \$113.8 million total expenses in FY2022, \$53.3 million (47%) was directly for our Core Mission. These expenses include instruction (38%), public service (25%), and research (37%). The changes in total expenses are mainly due to the application of Governmental Accounting Standards Board Statement No.68

(GASB 68) and No. 75 (GASB 75), Accounting and Financial Reporting for Employee Pension and Post-employment Benefits, and direct aid and grants awarded to students through HEERF. The rise in insurance premiums and utilities due to external factors also contributed to the general increase of expenses.


`Yearly' Graph (1 Day Average)







Core statement: Express ideas and facts to others effectively in a range of settings and in a variety of formats, particularly written, oral, and visual formats.




Understanding and Appreciation of Culturally Diverse People, Ideas and Values in a Democratic Context

Responsible use of Knowledge, Natural Resources, and Technology

Core statement: Evaluate informed and responsible action to address ethical, social, and environmental challenges in global systems and evaluates the local and broader consequences of individual and collective interventions.



An Appreciation of the Arts and Sciences

Core statement: Appreciate creative human expression by observing, organizing, and evaluate data information; making informed judgments about the past; recognizing and describing the significance of a particular artistic object, work, or experience; identifying many forms of creative works of art and human expression; beginning to understand the artistic languages of the performing and visual arts by recognizing common terms, techniques, and methods of expression; and engaging in creative expression through artistic activity.



An Interest in Personal Development and Lifelong Learning

Core statement: Using skills from information literacy (i.e. constructing a problem statement, locating and gathering sources, evaluating sources) students will articulate perspectives about educational and life experiences which provide foundation for expanded knowledge, growth, and maturity over time.
