JOSE MARIA EDITO KALAW TIROL is a graduate of the Ateneo de Manila University with a degree in AB Interdisciplinary Studies (1994) and an MA in History (1999). In 2015, he completed his PhD in Philippine Studies from the University of the Philippines - Diliman. His dissertation was the history and social memory of the Jewish refugees in the Philippines during the Second World War.



Dr. Tirol has given talks at various schools and fora, and has been interviewed on national TV about Social Memory and Martial Law in the Philippines. His essays on history and memory have appeared online for CNN Philippines and Esquire Philippines, and published in the Philippine Daily Inquirer. He also helped with the editing of the revised and annotated edition of Primitivo Mijares' *The Conjugal Dictatorship of Ferdinand and Imelda Marcos*, which was republished in 2017.

At present he is an Assistant Professor of the Department of History, handling classes in Western History, Philippine History, and various other electives such as memory studies, military history, and Martial Law in the Philippines. Since June 2017, he has also been serving as Director of the Office of Admission and Aid of the Ateneo de Manila University.
