What is Accreditation?

Accreditation is a voluntary process that universities undergo to demonstrate that they meet certain standards.

In 1963, the university began their relationship with the Western Association of School and Colleges (WASC) Senior College and University Commission (WSCUC) as their accrediting body.




The NMC and UOG


- Development of "BSCJ 3+1" partnership in May 2019

 - 12 MPA Candidates as of Spring 2024








