The Importance of Accreditation

What is Accreditation?

Accreditation is a voluntary process that universities undergo to demonstrate that they meet certain standards.

In 1963, the university began their relationship with the Western Association of School and Colleges (WASC) Senior College as University Commission (WSCUC) as their accrediting body.

Benefits of Accreditation

- Eligibility for Federal Financial Aid
- Assurance that students receive quality education
- Legitimacy to UOG degrees
- Ability to transfer credits to other accredited institutions

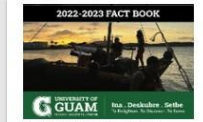

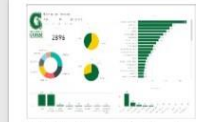

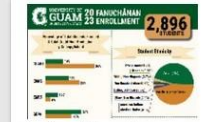
Curriculum Map

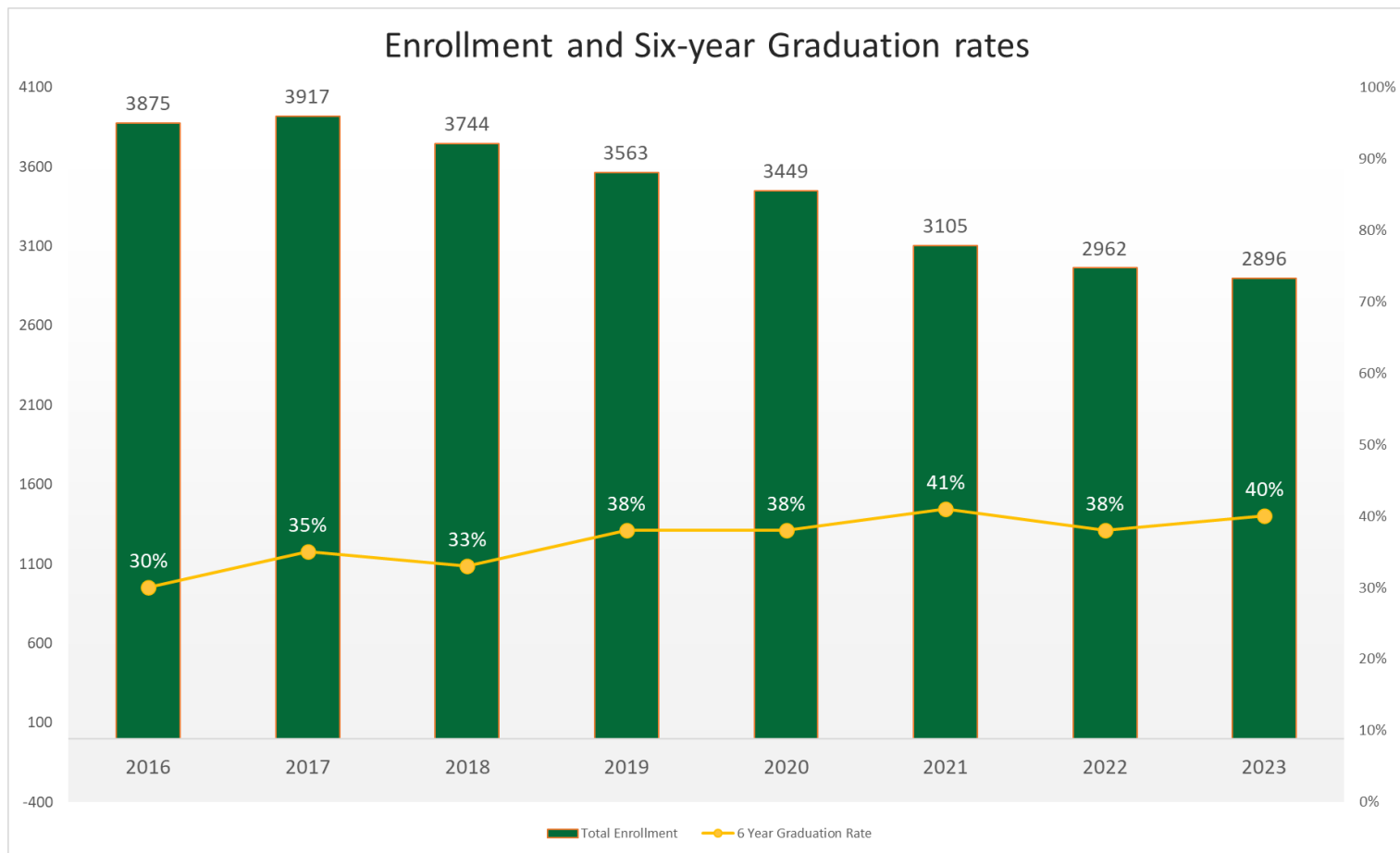

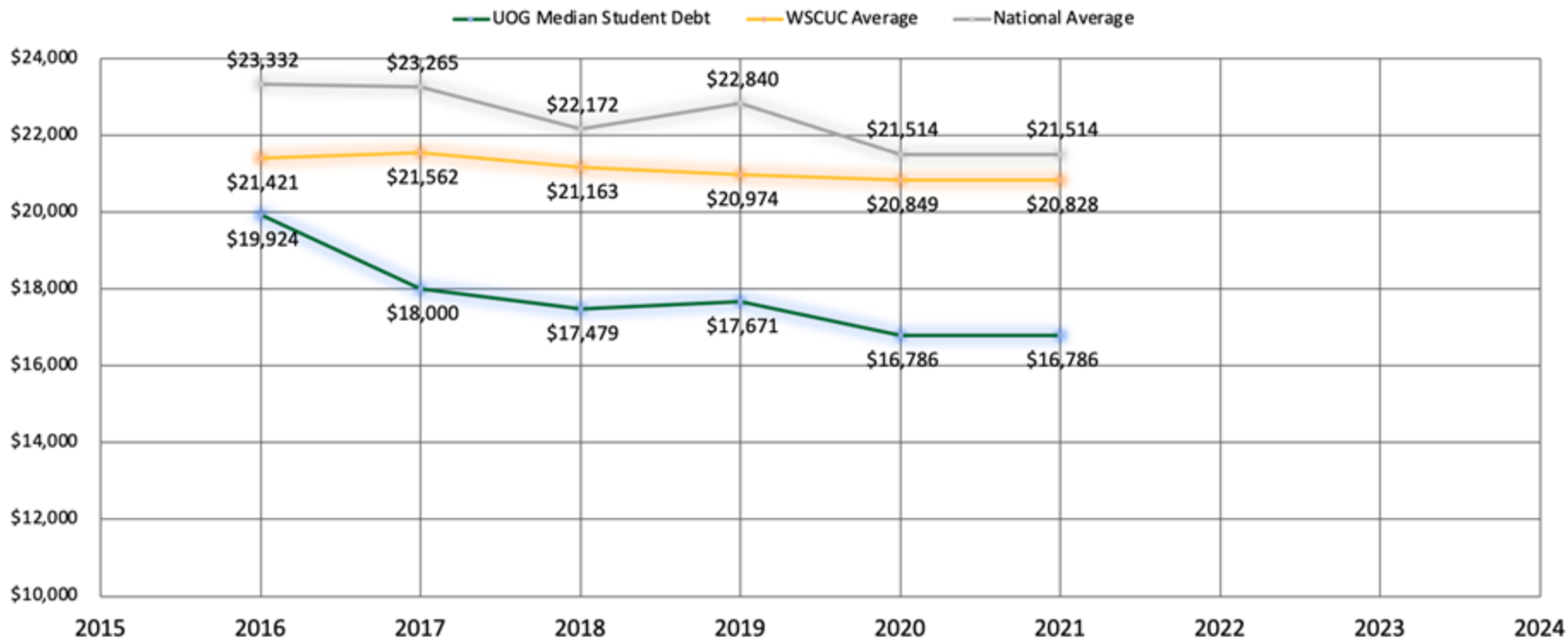

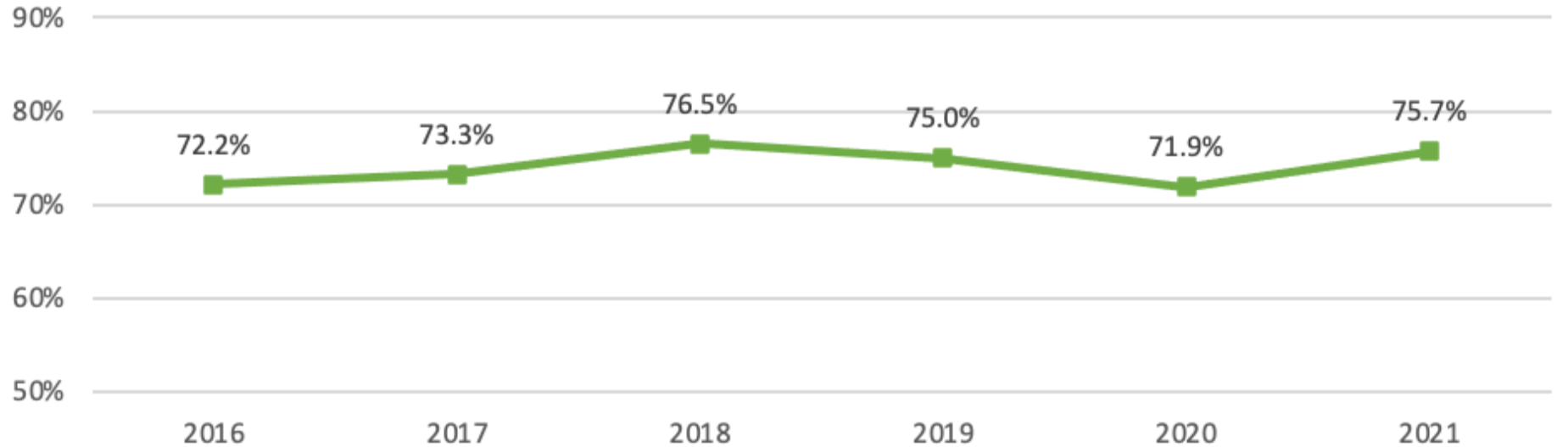
Median Undergraduate Student Debt
