BEFORE YOU REGISTER

Students are urged to contact the appropriate advisor as soon as the class schedule is available to discuss course prerequisites, the requirements of their academic programs, and the courses offered in the current class schedule.

WHEN YOU REGISTER

EARLY REGISTRATION - By Class Level.

ORIENTATION/REGISTRATION FOR NEW

STUDENTS. After applying for admission (see schedule of Application Deadlines) all new students must attend academic advising and orientation at the Student Center according to their scheduled date. Registration takes place at the Admissions & Records Office (1st floor Calvo Field House).

OPEN REGISTRATION. All students may reqister for classes at the Admissions & Records Office (1st floor Calvo Field House), or any Satellite Location, or WebAdvisor (http://advisor.uog.edu/).

SCHEDULE ADJUSTMENT- All students may make schedule adjustments at any Satellite Location or at the Admissions & Records Office.

Please Note: Any student with a medical and/or physical disability may receive special assistance for registration. Please contact the Student Counseling and Advising Accommodations office, Student Center Rotunda, Office #4, Tel. No. 735-2460, TTY: 735-2243 at least seven (7) days before registration.

ADMISSIONS & RECORDS. Records and Registration Technicians are available to assist students during registration periods Monday thru Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., 1st floor Calvo Field House.

WEBADVISOR. Continuing students may register for classes via WebAdvisor. See http://advisor.uog.edu for instructions.

AFTER REGISTRATION

SCHEDULE ADJUSTMENT. YOU MAY ADD OR DROP CLASSES DURING EARLY, OPEN, AND DURING THE SCHEDULE ADJUSTMENT PERIOD.

A schedule adjustment may be made at any Satellite Location or at the Admissions & Records Office.

AUDITING CLASSES. Student may apply to audit classes without credit. Please refer to the catalog for application procedures, deadlines, and fees.

IT IS THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE STUDENT TO REVIEW HIS/HER CLASS SCHEDULE FOR ACCURACY, COURSES NOT ATTENDED AND NOT DROPPED WILL RECEIVE THE GRADE OF "UW" (Unofficial Withdrawal) AND THE STUDENT WILL BE FINANCIALLY OBLIGATED FOR THE PAYMENT OF COURSE(S) AND OTHER FEES.

PAYMENT OF COURSES. Students must adhere to Payment Deadlines. All payments are made at the Cashier's Office located in the Administration Building. ONLINE CLASSES

If you registered for an online class, you may be wondering what is supposed to happen next. Here are some answers to some questions you might have...

When does the class start?

Online classes at UOG Moodle typically start at the same time as the on-campus classes. If the first day of on-campus classes starts on a Wednesday, then online classes will start on the same day. If you do not see your class when the semester starts, feel free to contact the UOG Moodle Help team (see contact information below).

How do I get into the class in UOG Moodle?

Can I be automatically added into the class in **UOG Moodle?**

The UOG Moodle Help team is working to make this process easier. At the start of the semester, you can check to see if you have already been added into the online classroom. If you are already in, you do not need an enrollment key. To see the classes that you are in, log in to UOG Moodle... then look in the "Navigation" block and click on "My courses". You will see any courses that you are already in. If you do not see your course, then you may need to contact the instructor to ask for an enrollment key.

NOTICE TO UOG STUDENTS: Prerequisites and @gotritons Student Email

PREREQUISITE IN PROGRESS. If you plan to pre-register for a course that requires prerequisites(s) AND you are currently taking the prerequisites(s) on the current semester, you no longer need to request for an override. You will be allowed to pre-register for the course without an override, HOWEVER, if you do not pass the prerequisite course(s) with the required grade, your pre-registered course will be deleted ("de-registered") from the class roster and you will be notified by email at your student @gotritons.edu.gu account.

Deregistration will occur no later than three weeks after the grades for the prerequisite courses have been submitted. You can view your grades online with your WebAdvisor account.

Please be advised that the University of Guam will now only use your student email account (@gotritons.uog.edu) to officially correspond when doing so by email. If you do not have your @gotritons address and PIN, please visit the Admissions & Records Office. TUITION & FEE PAYMENT

RESIDENT AND NON-RESIDENT STUDENTS

An applicant is initially classified as a resident or non-resident for tuition purposes at the time of application with the Office of Admissions. The classification, which is certified by the Registrar, is based upon information furnished by the student and from other relevant sources. In compliance with the Residency Policy passed by the Board of Regents on February 1996 and amended on May 1997 and June 17,2004, students in Non-Resident status are required to pay non-resident tuition.

The considerations used in determining Residency status are as follows:

- Establishment of a domicile on Guam or in one of the Freely Associated States (the Commonwealth of the Northern Marianas Islands, the Federated States of Micronesia, the Marshal Islands, or the Republic of Palau) as mandated by 17GC16125. (a) for a period of twelve month prior to the beginning of the term for which residency is claimed, or
- Evidence of residency for a period of twelve months or more prior to the beginning of the term for which residency is claimed. Evidence of residency will be shown by a student providing documentation from one of the following1:
 - Permanent employment on Guam (verification of employment)
 - Payment of income taxes of Guam (by student, or by parent/guardian if the student is a dependent).
 - Ownership or rental of living quarters on Guam.
 - Continue to use a Guam permanent address on ALL RECORDS (educational, employment, military, financial).
 - Retain your Guam voter's registration.
 - Maintain a Guam driver's license or vehicle registration. If it is necessary to change your license or registration while temporarily residing in another location, the license MUST be changed back to Guam within 10 days of the date of return to Guam, and the vehicle registration must be changed within 20 days of the date of return.
 - Village Mayor's certification of residency.
- Adjustment to Permanent Resident Status Students who have filed for an Adjustment to Permanent Resident Status will be eligible for resident rate only if they have resided on Guam for twelve consecutive months prior to applying to the university and have submitted the following supporting documents:
 - Notice of Action for the Adjustment to Permanent Resident Status from the
 - Proof of residency (documents to prove living on Guam for the last twelve months prior to applying to the university).

• A Notice of Action denying the student's application for an Adjustment to Permanent Resident Status will render the student ineligible for resident tuition rate.

The burden of proof is upon the student making a claim to resident student's status. The admission of students who knowingly provide false information for the purpose of achieving resident status shall be subject to cancellation and adjusted billing.

Exemptions to the twelve-month requirement where resident classification may apply1:

Graduate of a Guam High School

You may be entitled to an exemption from nonresident tuition if you attended high school in Guam for three (3) or more years AND graduated from a Guam high school. You are not eligible for this exemption if you are a nonimmigrant alien.

Attended Elementary and Middle School on **Guam.** You may be entitled to an exemption from nonresident tuition if you attended both elementary AND middle school on Guam. You are not eligible for this exemption if you are a nonimmigrant alien.

Active Military Duty. United States Military personnel and their authorized dependents (as defined by the Armed Services) are exempted from the 12 month residency requirement during the period such personnel are stationed in Guam on active duty.

NOTE: This exception does not apply to employees of other U.S. federal government departments, bureaus, or agencies or their dependents who are assigned or stationed to

Legal Place of Residency. You may be entitled to an exemption from nonresident tuition if you are able to demonstrate to the Registrar that Guam is your legal place of residency and you intend to make Guam you permanent place of

Permanent Resident. You may be entitled to an exemption from nonresident tuition if you are able to demonstrate that you permanently reside in Guam, but have been absent for only educational, training, or military reasons.

¹Non immigrant aliens, e.g. B,F,H,E Visa holders, are classified as non-residents and are not qualified for resident tuition rates or exemptions.

If you are classified as a non-resident and wish to be considered for resident reclassification, complete the "Petition for Residency Student Classification" before the semester or term you wish to enroll. Approved changes of status will become effective for the term or semester following the approval; they are not retroactive, and no refunds will be given.

Undergraduate students taking 5 credits or less will be charged 50% or half of the student fee found in the current catalog for the regular fall and Fañomnåkan semesters. Undergraduate student taking 5 credits or less during the summer term inclusive of sessions, A, B, and C, would be assessed a flat fee of \$152.50.

TUITION PAYMENTS. The University of Guam accepts VISA, MASTER CARD & AMERICAN EXPRESS credit cards for payment of tuition/fees.

Payments may be made at the Cashier's Window, Administration Building, during normal business hours, Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. or the Bursar's Office. Payment by mail should be posted in time to reach the University by the Payment deadline. Checks should be made payable to the University of Guam and mailed to: Student Accounts, Office of Financial Affairs, UOG Station, Mangilao, Guam 96923 or may pay on webadvisor http://advisor.uog.edu. Students who are waiting for financial aid or have not yet paid for their tuition and fees are still financially obligated.

If you do not officially drop or withdraw from class(es) within the time periods scheduled and still owe tuition and fees, you are liable for payment and will be billed accordingly. Therefore, it is crucial that you officially drop or withdraw from class(es) in a timely manner.

To drop classes students may use WebAdvisor. If WebAdvisor is not available students may submit request to drop to admitme@triton.uog.edu prior to deadline to drop for the semester.

ADMINISTRATIVE DROP. The Registrar may ADMINISTRATIVELY drop a student from any class for which she/he does not have the PREREQUISITE COURSES, or EXEMPTION from the prerequisites, whether the student enrolls in such a class during the registration or drop/ add period. Students who are ADMINISTRA-TIVELY DROPPED after the REFUND PERIOD are not eligible for a REFUND of tuition or fees.

WITHDRAWAL POLICY

DEADLINE TO WITHDRAW WITHOUT TRANSCRIPT RECORD ENTRY FOR FINAKPO' (SUMMER) 2018:

NOTE: All students may withdraw from a course or course during registration or add/ drop period except for TRANSITION STU-DENTS who must file a withdrawal form at Records Office.

VOLUNTARY WITHDRAWAL

SESSION A - JUNE 13 SESSION B - JUNE 20 SESSION C - JULY 11

NOTE: Students who officially withdraw after the deadline to withdraw without transcript record entry will receive a grade of "W" (Withdrawal) for all classes from which they withdrew. Withdrawal forms must be received by the Admissions and Records Office on or before the deadline; a technician will assist in making the withdrawal. NOTE: Withdrawal forms without all required signatures will NOT be accepted.

PETITION TO WITHDRAW

Students who miss the voluntary withdrawal deadline and desire to withdraw a class(es) may petition for permission to withdrawal by completing the Petition for Withdrawal Form which is available at the Records Office.

ADMISSION

DEFINITIONS (for tuition purposes):

Resident Student - Resident of Guam, Federated States of Micronesia (FSM), the Marshall Islands, Commonwealth of the Northern Marianas (CNMI), the Republic of Palau, and the United States who have met the Residency Requirements.

Non-Resident Student - Students who have not met the Residency Requirements. (See Residency Requirements)

UNDERGRADUATE - First-time students must complete an Application for Admission and must submit required documents by the deadline indicated in the Schedule of Application Deadline section. Official transcripts must be sent directly to the Admissions Office from the issuing institution(s). Applications may be

submitted online at https://www.applyweb. com/apply/guam/ or mailed to the Admissions Office, UOG Station, Mangilao, Guam 96923. Failure to include the application fee will result in the denial of the application. Applications may be dropped at the Admissions Office, located in the Calvo Field House, 1st floor.

NON-REFUNDABLE PROCESSING FEE

(\$52 Resident & Non-Resident/\$77 must be paid at the Cashier's Office, located in the Administration Building, before submitting your application. (Cashier's office hours: 8:00 am - 4:00 pm)

New Freshmen - All entering Freshmen must take the English and Math Placement Examinations prior to registration. Students who place into EN109 or have not taken the English and Math Placement Tests will be limited in their enrollment to certain approved courses for transition students.

Transfer Students - Students (applicants) are required to take the English and Math Placement examinations and may only be exempted if an official transcript has been submitted indicating the completion with a grade of "C" or better in the following:

- (1) three semester hours of college English for exemption from the English exam, and
- (2) three semester hours in intermediate algebra, college algebra, or finite math for exemption from the math exam.

Non-Degree - Applicants seeking specific courses for personal enrichment or professional advancement who do not seek a degree program may apply as a Non-Degree Undergraduate. A Non-Degree student is not required to submit high school or previous college records or to take placement examinations unless the student is seeking to enroll in English and/or Math courses. (See Undergraduate Catalog - "Non-Degree Student" for more information and requirements).

Graduate Students - A graduate applicant seeking admission to a graduate program or to enroll in graduate courses must complete an Application for Admission at the Graduate Admissions Office and provide supporting documents by the application deadline indicated in the Schedule of Application Deadlines. Official transcripts must be forwarded directly to the Graduate Admissions Office from the issuing institution(s). Applications for admission to Graduate Admissions Office are available at, and must be submitted to, Graduate Admissions Office located on the 1st floor Calvo Field House. Applications without the appropriate fee will not be processed.

Former Students (Re-Entry) - Students who have not attended the University for one or more regular semesters (Fall or Spring) are required to submit an "Application for Re-Entry" at the Records Office or Graduate Admissions Office located on the 1st floor Calvo Field House at least one week before registration.

Official transcripts from all colleges and/or universities attended during the student's non-attendance at UOG are required and must be submitted directly to the Admissions & Records Office from the issuing institution(s) prior to registration. Proof of residency and standard enrollment requirements may be applied.

GRADUATION

Students who plan to graduate must file an Application for Degree at the Records Office early in the semester before the semester in which he/she plans to graduate. Application fee is \$49.00. There is an additional expense for postage and handling if the diploma is to be mailed off-island. If a student fails to complete degree requirements, after filing the application, he/she must then submit a new application. Reapplication Fee is \$24.00. The deadline to apply for degree completion in the 2018 Summer and Fall is Feb. 28, 2018.


IMPORTANT FACTS TO KNOW

- 2. All majors in SBPA must complete EN111 and MA 110 OR higher with a grade of "C" or better before enrolling in 300 or 400 level courses.
- 3. A student may not take a lower level course after completing a more advanced level course without written permission from the appropriate department/unit.
- 4. If your academic program does not specifically require MA161A as a major requirement or a prerequisite course, MA110 or MA115 may be used to satisfy your general education requirements.
- 5. Because it is not possible to describe in this schedule all Admissions and Registration Policies as well as pertinent rules and regulations, students are advised to use the 2017-2018 Undergraduate and Graduate Catalog, as tools, in understanding the rules and regulations which govern the conduct and discipline applicable to students.

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
