ABOUT COMMENCEMENT

Academic Dress and Procession

The history of academic dress dates to the Middle Ages when many scholars were also clerics and wore costume of the monastic orders. In 1321, the University of

Cambridge adopted specific styles and color combinations. American colleges and universities desired to adopt a standard code for academic dress for colleges and universities in the United States. The standards continue to be followed by the American Council of Education.

The costumes worn today are all traditional and their colors, trimmings and patterns interpret the degree, the field of learning, and the institution that conferred the degree. The bachelor's gown has long pointed sleeves and is designed to be worn closed; the master's gown has an oblong sleeves open at the wrist. The rear part of its oblong shape is square cut and the front part

has an arc cut away. The doctor's gown has bell-shaped sleeves, is faced with velvet and has three bars across the sleeves. The color of the velvet is distinctive of the degree.

The hood tells the story. The type of degree bachelor's, master's, doctor's, is indicated by the width of the velvet edging and the length of the hood, the doctor's hood being the longest and of a fuller shape. The color of the velvet edging denotes the field of learning and the lining denotes the school that conferred the degree.

The color of the tassel, worn on the left side of the mortarboard, indicates the field of

study and is gold for those with a doctor's degree. The colors you will see today in the hoods and gown of our faculty represent the various fields of learning: white, arts, letters, and humanities; drab, business administration; light blue, education; apricot,

nursing; dark blue, philosophy; and golden yellow, science.

The academic procession is led by the grand marshal, who is the President of the Faculty Senate. A traditional order to procession is followed: First come the candidates for degrees according to the order in which the degrees are to be conferred; next, members of the faculty led by the faculty marshal, the honorary degree recipient and the other members of the platform party followed by the president of the university. The order is reversed for the recessional

You will note that some of today's graduates are wearing a gold stole. This stole indicates that the wearer is graduating

with academic honors.

The Mace

Historically, the mace was a heavy, spiked club used during the Middle Ages to break armor in battle. Today, the mace is an ornamental staff borne as a symbol of authority before a public official or legislative body. The mace of the University of Guam is made of ifil wood into which are carved ifil leaves. Ifil wood was chosen because of its performance, strength and value, all of which reflect the major characteristics of the University of Guam. The mace, designed by Forrest G. Rogers, was carved and donated to the University of Guam by the Department of Corrections.

COMMENCEMENT ADDRESS MANNY CRISOSTOMO

Pulitzer Prize-Winning Photojournalist and Visual Storyteller

Guam's first and only Pulitzer Prize winner, Manny Crisostomo, is a tireless advocate and chronicler of indigenous people and cultures of the Pacific, including CHamorus living in the Marianas and in the diaspora.

Crisostomo is also a multimedia photojournalist and documentarian who has won some of journalism's most prestigious awards. Other titles he's held over the years: adjunct journalism instructor, book author, magazine publisher and art gallery owner.

In 1989, he won the most coveted prize in journalism, the Pulitzer, while working as a photographer for the Detroit Free Press. He was recognized for his work in a special section, "A Class Act, The Life and Times of Southwestern High School," which documented the challenges faced by teenagers in a racially diverse community that was contending with drugs, violence and economic hardship.



Manny Crisostomo, Pulitzer Prize-Winning Photojournalist and Visual Storyteller

On Guam, islanders best know Crisostomo's photography work focusing on the lives and culture of CHamorus, as well as the island landscapes captured in his books "Legacy of Guam: I Kustumbren Chamoru," and "Guam From the Heavens."

In 1995, Crisostomo launched Latte Magazine, a monthly publication highlighting life on Guam and in Micronesia. "A magazine ... that respects the Chamoru identity and heritage, and another that revels in contemporary Guam and our island's multiculturalism ... This spirit of duality is the true core of Latte," he wrote on the inaugural issue.

His successful foray into multimedia resulted in a slew of awards, including the Robert F. Kennedy Journalism Award for the Disadvantaged in international photography for "The Leftover People," which chronicled the last wave of Hmong refugees.

In 2016, he returned home to attend and document the 12th Festival of Pacific Arts when it was held on Guam. The deep renewal of a reconnection to home and the islands was transmuted in his book published a year later, "Journeys To The Heart: Pacific Islanders Celebrate Their Indigenous Cultures."

The book sold out and a redesigned, reimagined second edition of "Journeys To The Heart: Pacific Islanders Celebrate Their Indigenous Cultures" was published in 2024.

HONORARY DEGREE JULIAN AGUON, ESQ.

Human Rights Lawyer and Author

Julian Aguon is an international human rights lawyer whose work sits at the intersection of climate justice, decolonization, and Indigenous rights. As the founder of Blue Ocean Law, he has shaped international legal precedent, including advisory opinion proceedings before the International Court of Justice on climate change.

A Pulitzer Prize finalist and Right Livelihood Award laureate, Julian is also an educator, essayist, and mentor dedicated to training the next generation of advocates from the Pacific and beyond. He is the author of The Properties of Perpetual Light and No Country for Eight-Spot Butterflies.
