About Commencement

Academic Dress and Procession

The history of academic dress dates to the Middle Ages when many scholars were also clerics and wore costume of the monastic orders. In 1321, the University of Cambridge adopted specific styles and color combinations. American colleges and universities desired to adopt a standard code for academic dress for colleges and universities in the United States. The standards continue to be followed by the American Council of Education.

The costumes worn today are all traditional and their colors, trimmings and patterns interpret the degree, the field of learning, and the institution that conferred the degree. The bachelor's gown has long pointed sleeves and is designed to be worn closed; the master's gown has an oblong sleeves open at the wrist. The rear part of its oblong shape is square cut and the front part has an arc cut away. The doctor's gown has bell-shaped sleeves, is faced with velvet and has three bars across the sleeves. The color of the velvet is distinctive of the degree.

The hood tells the story. The type of degree bachelor's, master's, doctor's, is indicated by the width of the velvet edging and the length of the hood, the doctor's hood being the longest and of a fuller shape. The color of the velvet edging denotes the field of learning and the lining denotes the school that conferred the degree.

The color of the tassel, worn on the left side of the mortarboard, indicates the field of study and is gold for those with a doctor's degree. The colors you will see today in the hoods and gown of our faculty represent the various fields of learning: white, arts, letters, and humanities; drab, business administration; light blue, education; apricot, nursing; dark blue, philosophy; and golden yellow, science.

The academic procession is led by the grand marshal, who is the President of the Faculty Senate. A traditional order to procession is followed: First come the candidates for

degrees according to the order in which the degrees are to be conferred; next, members of the faculty led by the faculty marshal, the honorary degree recipient and the other members of the platform party followed by the president of the university. The order is reversed for the recessional.

You will note that some of today's graduates are wearing a gold stole. This stole indicates that the wearer is graduating with academic honors.

The Mace

Historically, the mace was a heavy, spiked club used during the Middle Ages to break armor in battle. Today, the mace is an

ornamental staff borne as a symbol of authority before a public official or legislative body. The mace of the University of Guam is made of ifil wood into which are carved ifil leaves. Ifil wood was chosen because of its performance, strength and value, all of which reflect the major characteristics of the University of Guam. The mace, designed by Forrest G. Rogers, was carved and donated to the University of Guam by the Department of Corrections.

Commencement Address Doctor of Laws Honoris Causa Her Excellency Dr. Hilda C. Heine President of the Republic of the Marshall Islands

President Hilda C. Heine is one of the three women elected to the Nitijela following the November 2015 general elections representing Aur Atoll for a term of four years. She previously served as the Minister of Education in the administration of former President Christopher J. Loeak.

Prior to entering politics, President Heine was the Program Director of Pacific Comprehensive Assistance Center at the Pacific Resources for Education and Learning (PREL) in Majuro from 2006 to 2011 and Director of Policy and Capacity Building and Scholar of FAS Education, consecutively, for PREL and based in Honolulu from 1995 to 2006. Before relocating to the State of Hawai' i, President Heine served the Government of the Republic of the Marshall Islands starting as a classroom teacher, school counselor, school administrator, college President before being named as Secretary of Education.

During her tenure as President of the College of the Marshall Islands and as Secretary of Education, President Heine supervised the transformation of the College from a continuing education

program into a fully operational community college. President Heine currently serves as an advisor, officer and member of multiple taskforces, committees, and working groups. As Minister of Education, President Heine headed the RMI Teacher Standards and Licensing Board and Chaired the Human Resources in Health Task Force. President Heine was awarded an honorary doctorate degree from the College of the Marshall Islands.

President Heine was born on Jaluit Atoll to Reverend Bourne and Kathy Heine in 1951 where she grew up and attended a public school and moved to Majuro to pursue her secondary level education at the Marshall Islands High School. Following high school studies, President Heine attended school in the United States where she earned her undergraduate degree at the University of Oregon in 1970, a master's degree at the University of Hawaii in 1975, and an Educational Doctorate at the University of Southern California in 2004. President Heine and her Husband, Thomas Kijiner Jr., have three children and five grandchildren, and both live in Majuro. President Heine co-authored a number of publications and reports and reads historical and contemporary writings with special emphasis on education and social administrations in small islands developing states.

Bilung Glovia G. Salii Master of Micronesian Traditional Knowledge Konoris Causa

Bilung Gloria Gibbon Salii of Koror, Republic of Palau has dedicated the last 44 years of her life to serving her island nation by perpetuating education, environmental preservation and Palauan culture as a whole.

Born January 5, 1950, Bilung Salii assumed the title of Acting Ibedul in the middle of her undergraduate collegiate career following the death of her uncle, and later on was named Bilung after the passing of her grandmother—a title she has held for the last 40+ years.

Bilung Salii has spearheaded and championed many local, national and several international causes ranging from women's rights and powers, cultural heritage and preservation, environmental conservation, health, education, and more.

Bilung Salii founded Mechesil Belau (Women of Palau) and its annual Women's Conference in 1994 but was the recipient of the Gusi Peace Prize for International Women's Rights Advocacy in 2003. She also

founded and manages the Ngarachamayong Cultural Center (NCC), which aims to preserve the tradition and culture of Palau.

As a long-time advocate for education, Bilung Salii has served as the Palau Institutional Review Board Chairperson from 2010 to the present; held multiple administrative roles at Palau Community College over the last 20 years including Board of Trustees Founding Member, Vice Chairperson, and more; served as one-time Chairperson for the College of Micronesia System Board of Regents; and is a Member of the Association of Community College Trustees.

Bilung Salii is noted for her expertise in Palauan traditions, culture, and practices. She has established her undisputed role as a matriarch and teacher—perpetuating traditional women's leadership and development, community organization, and policy development. She serves as a mentor and teacher for taro field restorations and development of new taro patches and common traditional herbal medicines, planted trees for traditional grass skirts materials and thatched roofs.

Bilung Salii has and continues to make major positive impacts in Palau and the Micronesian region through her dedication to protect our region's unique cultures, environments, and people.
