4. UG Course Revision: MA 205 Multivariable Calculus. Log no. 5404. Contact person F. Lee (flee@triton.uog.edu). *Distributed to UCRC on 15 Aug 2016.*

Background: Increasing the number of credit hours from 3 to 4 credit hours allows the course to contain vector calculus. Vector calculus makes the course more useful for Pre-Engineering and Chemistry majors, and for Mathematics majors who wish to enter graduate school, as well as making the course comparable to similar courses at other universities.

Review Process: This request has received the following endorsements: Program and Division chairs, as well as College AAC on 24 May 2016, and College Dean on 8 June 2016. The UCRC chair presented the committee's recommendation to the Faculty Senate on 15 September 2016.

Background: MA 205 (Multivariable Calculus) will become a 4-credit-hour course (Item 4 above). This change will therefore increase the number of required credit hours for a major in Mathematics from 52 to 53 credit hours and for a minor in Mathematics from 28 to 29 hours.

Review Process: This request has received the following endorsements: Program and Division chairs, as well as College AAC on 24 May 2016, and College Dean on 8 June 2016. The UCRC chair presented the committee's recommendation to the Faculty Senate on 15 September 2016.

Background: The Chemistry Program would like to include Instrumental Methods of Analysis (CH 410 + CH 410L) within the requirements for the major, because most other Chemistry programs include instrumentation. Instrumentation is also an essential career skill for a chemist. This would increase the number of required credit hours from 63 to 68 (3 credit hours for the lecture and 2 credit hours for the lab).

Review Process: This request has received the following endorsements: Program and Division chairs on 29 June 2016, College AAC on 30 June 2016, College Dean on 31 June 2016. The UCRC chair presented the committee's recommendation to the Faculty Senate on 15 September 2016.

Background: The Faculty Senate in December 2011 charged the GERC with evaluation of the GE curriculum which resulted in the Faculty Senate endorsing the UOG General Education Framework on 13 November 2014. For the last 2 years the GERC has refined the framework, with faculty consultation have developed SLOs for the first tier and thematic statements for the second, they have solicited and evaluated courses for populating the framework, evaluated impacts of changes to the GE plan with regard to number of possible classes and number of possible "seats" for students, and compared the final populated proposal to plans at peer and aspirant institutions.

Review Process: The GERC chair first presented the General Education Curriculum at UOG to the Faculty Senate on 5 May 2016. As a result of last minute lobbying, the GERC clarified this document and distributed it to the Faculty Senate on 25 August 2016. Confusion with respect to which file was the most current complete file resulted in the GERC re-presenting the committee's recommendation to the Faculty Senate on 15 September 2016.

MOTION: To endorse the GERC's Proposed General Education Curriculum at UOG as contained in attachment 8.


