MINIMUM QUALIFICATION:

Bachelor's Degree or Associate's Degree with 3 years relevant and related work experience.

NECESSARY SPECIAL QUALIFICATION:

Must have a valid driver's license.

QUALIFICATIONS REQUIRED:

Pursuant to Public Law 26-87 as amended by Public Law 29-113, all future employees of any position within the government of Guam will be required at minimum to possess one of the following:

- 1. A high school diploma; or
- 2. Successful completion of General Education Development (GED) Test; or
- 3. The equivalent of a general education high school program; or
- 4. Successful completion of a certification program, from a recognized accredited or certified vocational technical institution, in a specialized field for the job.

CHARACTER OF DUTIES:

This position will be part of the CNAS Media Team, which supports the three-part mission of the College of Natural & Applied Sciences – instruction, extension, and research – through the production of communication, marketing, and outreach materials as well as events. The CNAS Media Team also supports the two units within CNAS: Cooperative Extension & Outreach and the Western Pacific Tropical Research Center.

Work is generally carried out in the office, at events, and in the field, both on and off campus. The employee will be expected to contribute marketing and communications ideas that advance the visibility and reputation of CNAS and its programs and people. The employee will interview faculty, alumni, and staff; create engaging and newsworthy story angles; and produce feature stories, news articles, web copy, social media content, ad/brochure copy, video scripts, among other written content. The employee will be the primary publisher on the school's social media accounts and will ensure a consistent stream of engaging and relevant content specific to each platform.

The employee will also assist in the promotion of certain events via radio or video interviews with the media. Employee will be expected to carry out additional professional level activities, including event coordination and photography for events and stories and may also assist with basic website edits and developing marketing emails and newsletters.

KNOWLEDGE, ABILITIES AND/OR SKILLS:

Ability to communicate, interact, and collaborate effectively and professionally with students, faculty, alumni, colleagues, and community members. Ability to manage multiple projects and occasionally work under tight deadlines.

EDUCATION:

Applicants claiming degrees or credit hours are required to have an original or certified copy of the documents (e.g. transcripts, high school diploma or GED certification) accompany the application.

WORK ELIGIBILITY:

Submission of completed job applications authorizes the University of Guam to seek and obtain information regarding the applicant's suitability for employment. All factors which are job related may be investigated (e.g. previous employment, educational credentials, and criminal records). All information obtained may be used to determine the applicant's eligibility for employment in accordance with equal employment opportunity guidelines. In addition, the applicant releases previous employers and job related sources from legal liability for the information provided.

Section 25103, Chapter 25, Title 10 of the Guam Code Annotated requires college or university employees to undergo a physical examination, to include a test for tuberculosis (skin or x-ray), prior to employment and at least annually thereafter. A report of such examination must be conducted by a licensed physician within a state or territory of the United States and must be submitted upon request.

Federal law requires presentation of eligibility to work in the United States within seventy-two (72) hours of reporting for employment. Specifically, 8 USC 1324A requires the employer to verify the identity and eligibility to work in the United States of all newly hired employees. The University of Guam is required to comply with this law on a non-discriminatory basis. If you are hired to fill a position within the University of Guam, you will be required to present valid documents to comply with the law.

POLICE AND COURT CLEARANCE:

Pursuant to Public Law No. 28-24 and Executive Order No. 2005-34, applicants selected for a position are required to provide original police and court (Superior Court of Guam) clearances of no more than three (3) months old prior to commencement of employment. Off-island applicants must obtain clearances from their place of residence. Applicants are responsible for fees associated with obtaining the clearances.
