MINIMUM QUALIFICATION:

Bachelor's Degree or Associate's Degree with three (3) years relevant and related work experience.

NECESSARY SPECIAL QUALIFICATION:

Must have a valid driver's license.

QUALIFICATIONS REQUIRED:

Pursuant to Public Law 26-87 as amended by Public Law 29-113, all future employees of any position within the government of Guam will be required at minimum to possess one of the following:

- 1. A high school diploma; or
- 2. Successful completion of General Education Development (GED) Test; or
- 3. The equivalent of a general education high school program; or
- 4. Successful completion of a certification program, from a recognized accredited or certified vocational technical institution, in a specialized field for the job.

CHARACTER OF DUTIES:

Provide technical administrative support for Cooperative Extension & Outreach (CE&O) grant programs and work tasks as required for all project phases. Prepare all required program and project reports on a weekly, monthly, and quarterly basis; written reports must summarize tasks and deliverables. Oversee office operations, project staff work, and task reporting. Oversee Contract Negotiation with Specialist. Ensure compliance with due dates and Institutional Review Board (IRB) requirements, as required. Participate in workgroup meetings. Must be able to communicate with supervisors, project staff, and project partners by providing information to collaborating agencies, CE&O, and project coordination with funding agency. Oversee coding and keying in tasks. Verify the accuracy and validity of data entered, coding, and keying application; correcting errors. Provide project survey support. Data collection, edits, and verification. Perform descriptive tabulation reporting and prepare survey reports. Perform all other related duties as assigned.

KNOWLEDGE, ABILITIES AND/OR SKILLS:

Knowledge of Microsoft applications or iOS equivalents; ability to prepare reports and analyze data; ability to record, report, and/or summarize survey results; ability to ensure compliance with Institutional Review Board (IRB) requirements; skilled in use of computer, peripherals, and accessories to create or record data; ability to communicate and collaborate effectively and professionally with students, faculty, colleagues, vendors, and community members; and ability to manage and simultaneously make progress on multiple projects and occasionally work under tight deadlines.

EDUCATION:

Applicants claiming degrees or credit hours are required to have an original or certified copy of the documents (e.g. transcripts, high school diploma or GED certification) accompany the application.

WORK ELIGIBILITY:

Submission of completed job applications authorizes the University of Guam to seek and obtain information regarding the applicant's suitability for employment. All factors which are job related may be investigated (e.g. previous employment, educational credentials, and criminal records). All information obtained may be used to determine the applicant's eligibility for employment in accordance with equal employment opportunity guidelines. In addition, the applicant releases previous employers and job related sources from legal liability for the information provided.

Section 25103, Chapter 25, Title 10 of the Guam Code Annotated requires college or university employees to undergo a physical examination, to include a test for tuberculosis (skin or x-ray), prior to employment and at least annually thereafter.

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A report of such examination must be conducted by a licensed physician within a state or territory of the United States and must be submitted upon request.

Federal law requires presentation of eligibility to work in the United States within seventy-two (72) hours of reporting for employment. Specifically, 8 USC 1324A requires the employer to verify the identity and eligibility to work in the United States of all newly hired employees. The University of Guam is required to comply with this law on a non-discriminatory basis. If you are hired to fill a position within the University of Guam, you will be required to present valid documents to comply with the law.

POLICE AND COURT CLEARANCE:

Pursuant to Public Law No. 28-24 and Executive Order No. 2005-34, applicants selected for a position are required to provide original police and court (Superior Court of Guam) clearances of no more than three (3) months old prior to commencement of employment. Off-island applicants must obtain clearances from their place of residence. Applicants are responsible for fees associated with obtaining the clearances.

Applicants must submit a Government of Guam Application Form to the Human Resources Office, located at the Administration Building, between 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Monday through Friday except holidays.
