- Earn \$12.37 per hour as a limited-term Government of Guam employee during the field data collection period
- Travel to designated households to conduct interviews with island residents to help individuals complete an electronic survey
- Answer any questions residents may have regarding the survey
- Undertake a range of procedural, operational, and administrative duties
- Read and navigate maps
- Maintain confidentiality

## **Qualifications:**

- 18 years of age or older
- High school diploma or equivalent
- Valid driver's license and transportation for fieldwork
- Police and court clearances
- Drug test
- Self-motivated

- Able to work autonomously and make decisions independently
- Prior survey experience a plus but not a requirement
- Must be able to work on Saturdays and outside of normal hours until 7 p.m. or 8 p.m.
