QUESTION & ANSWER SHEET NO. 1

In response to the written "Questions" and/or 'Request for Clarifications' UOG received as of May 10, 2021 @ 3:58pm from vendor: DMR, LLC

Question 1: Scope of Work on Page 20 of the IFB indicates "This bid is to select and award a contract for a qualified vendor to supply and deliver all Computer Lab Equipment." Is this an all-or-none IFB?

Answer: **UOG confirms that this is an all-or-none bid.**

Question 2: Please specify the warranty term for bid Items 1, 2, and 3.

Answer: **UOG confirms 2-year limited hardware warranty for repair and/or replacement of defective parts or systems.**

Question 3: Section II. Product Specifications, #5, on Page 20 of the IFB lists three optional items. Where pricing for these optional items should be listed in the Bid Form.

Answer: **UOG confirms that these optional specifications refer to Desktop Computer I/O and add-ons. It is listed as optional so that a proposed equipment can't be disqualified solely because its configuration does not allow these options to be removed and/or included. These options are not necessary but there are some pre-built systems that do not allow for a configuration with or without one or all of these 3 options.**

Question 4: Section II, #2, item f. on Page 20 of the IFB specifies "At least 1x HDMI, 1x VGA and 1x Audio Output." Video Graphics Array (VGA) is an old legacy video connector. The common PC manufacturer display port configurations are Display Port (DP) and HDMI. Will UOG accept a DP port instead of a VGA port?

Answer: **UOG confirms that we will accept a DP configuration instead of a VGA port.**

Question 5: Section II, #2, item g, specifies "At least 2x USB 2.0, 2x USB 3.2 Gen 2, 1x USB 3.2 Gen 2 Type-C, and RJ-45 Input."

a. Will UOG accept USB 3.2 Gen 1 technology for the 2x USB 3.2 Gen 2 requirement?

Yes, USB 3.2 Gen 1 is acceptable.

b. Will UOG accept USB 3.2 Gen 1 Type-C technology for the 1x USB 3.2 Gen 2 Type-C requirement?

Answer: **a. UOG confirms USB 3.2 Gen 1 is acceptable.**
