## **Course Requirements:**

#### **Examinations**

There will be two exams during the semester. The final examination for this class is scheduled for Tuesday, May 20<sup>th</sup> at 2:00pm. Your final examination will not be cumulative. Make-up exams will only be given under extreme circumstances.

#### **Attendance**

Regular class attendance is required. You will be allowed three unexcused absences during the semester. Thereafter, .5 will be deducted from your final grade for each unexcused absence.

## **Research Project**

You will be assigned to critique an art exhibition currently on display and write a 3-5 page paper about the exhibition.

#### **Oral Presentation**

A 10 (ten) minute oral presentation based on the topic of your research project is to be given before the end of the semester.

#### **Volunteer Hours**

You will be required to volunteer for at least 20 (twenty) hours, outside of class time, at the Isla Center for the Arts. There are a number of opportunities during which you may volunteer including exhibition/display preparation, installations, deinstallations, receptions and providing guided tours of the exhibition on display.

# **Reading Assignments**

There is no single text for this class but I will distribute a variety of reading materials throughout the semester.

# Grading

Your final grade for the class will be calculated in the following manner: Volunteer hours (10%), Research project (10%), Oral presentation (10%), Exams (20%), and Class participation (50%).

The grading scale/system will be as follows: 98-100%=A+; 93-97%=A; 90-92%=A-; 87=89%=B+; 83-86%=B; 80-82%=B-; 77-79%=C+; 73-76%=C; 70-76%=C; 60-69%=D; Below 60%=F
