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MASTER'S DEGREE PROGRAM

The School of Education offers the University of Guam's teachers, and school consultants. Some become Technology and Literacy: 3 Credits first online program: a Master of Education Degree with specialization in Reading.

The program is ideal for practicing teachers from Guam or the region who are interested in becoming specialists in reading and language arts.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

· A student who wishes to be admitted into this specialization ED601 Introduction to Research Methods (3) must have a Bachelor's degree in Education or a related field ED602 Qualitative Inquiry in Education (3) OR II for Reading Specialist with a passing score (e.g. psychology, English, linguistics, etc.).

· Teaching experience of one or more years in K-12 schools.

· Reading faculty will conduct an online admissions interview as an entry level assessment for new applicants.

THIS PROGRAM PREPARES PROFESSIONALS FOR THE FOLLOWING ROLES:

· To develop students' literacy (reading and writing) in ED641 Middle/Secondary Reading and Writing in language arts and across the curriculum, with an emphasis on the Content Areas (3) pre-school, elementary and secondary years.

· To assess and instruct students with diverse literacy needs in Young Adults (3) regular classrooms, as well as specialized settings ED643 Practicum: Literacy Assessment (3) (developmental or basic classes, ESL classes, special education ED644 Practicum: Literacy Instructional Lab (3) classes, adult literacy centers, etc.).

· To participate as a member of a professional learning Literacy (3) community, reflecting on practice and contributing to the ED646 Organization and Supervision of Reading improvement of instructional programs, advancement of Programs (3) knowledge and practice of colleagues.

· Graduates find diverse professional positions, with the (3) majority serving in schools as classroom teachers, ED649 Capstone Seminar in Literacy (3) reading/language arts resource teachers, special education

diagnosticians and reading specialists in clinical ED638 Teaching with the Internet (3) settings or private practice, and some go on to doctoral study.

- Clinical experience in the diagnosis and instruction ED690 Special Project (6) OR ED695 Thesis (6) of individuals with reading and writing problems is provided in ED643 and ED644
