APPLICATION DEADLINE: Wednesday, July 14

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- ✓ Current UOG faculty member
- ✓ Early Stage Investigator within 10 years of receiving final degree

APPLICATION COMPONENTS

- ✓ Detailed research plan to complete a manuscript (preferably, by December 2021) for submission to a peer-reviewed journal
- ✓ Alternatively, a plan to prepare a research proposal to a funding agency, e.g., NIH, DOD, AICR
- ✓ A list of members of your Mentoring Committee
- \checkmark A list of co-authors or research partners
- ✓ Your curriculum vitae
- ✓ Your Career Development Plan

APPLICATION WORKSHOPS

There will be mandatory application workshops held on **June 25** and **July 9 at 11am** to discuss how to prepare a research plan, design an appropriate project, select a team, and create a personal career development plan. These workshops will be hosted on Zoom link <u>https://zoom.us/j/3775919264</u>. They will be repeat sessions, so applicants do not need to attend both.

SELECTED PROJECTS

Selected investigators will be provided a short contract between the PIPCHE leaders, the faculty member, and the faculty member's dean, which will specify buyout and load allocation (FTE) information, planned outcome, and the consequences should the paper or grant not be finished. Selected participants will also meet for monthly writing workshops hosted by the REC leads as well as with their assigned mentor
